Profile of the Balurghat B.Ed. College

HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

A host of dignified and professionally successful persons, better placed persons of the soil and founding leaders of the college, who are eminent educationists and efficient academicians and educational administrators with wide knowledge and experience about the existing situation of three levels of education in the country, more especially about quality teacher education and the quality of education for the academic betterment had envisioned a college of teacher education at Dakshin Dinajpur district, which they, with active support from Balurghat Educational Promotion and Welfare Trust and a long list of local educationists, leaders and social reformers rendered into a reality in 2004. The college, being the first ever self-financed teacher education college in North Bengal, has been acknowledged as a reputed post graduate college of teacher education in West Bengal.

MISSION AND VISION OF THE COLLEGE

The mission behind the college is to impart quality teacher education to prospective as well as in-service teachers not only of the district but of North Bengal as well with the firm aims to educate and train them to play meaningful and effective role in the classroom and to generate quality devoted teachers to give quality education to pupils in the classrooms. The vision of the college founding team is to ensure and provide them quality teacher education and training so as to enable them to produce quality students to achieve quality national education which is essential for national development in all domains. Students are additionally trained to play constructive roles as responsible members of the society as well as dutiful and responsible citizens of India.

STATUS OF THE COLLEGE

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The college is a non-profiting, unaided, self-financed institution of teacher education and training. It is managed and maintained by a welfare Trust with the denomination of Balurghat Educational Promotion and Welfare Trust. The college was established on July 7, 2004 and duly recognized by National Council for Teachers Education, Government of India and approved by Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal. It was first affiliated to the University of North Bengal. The college was then brought under the affiliating jurisdiction of the University of Gour Banga, Malda in April, 2009. It was granted permanent affiliation to this university. The college has now been placed under the affiliation of The West Bengal University of Teachers' Training, Education Planning and Administration presently renamed as Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Teacher Education University ,25/2 & 25/3, Ballygunge Circular Road, Kolkata 700019 with effect from February 01, 2017. The college is now included in the status list under section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. The college has been accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), valid up to 26-11-2022 & applied for further assessment and accreditation to the NAAC Authority.

The inputs received from the different departments and sections and the related outputs have been examined and validated on the basis of the supporting documents provided by the college, as well as on the basis of interactions with the Principal, IQAC Coordinator, faculty members and Superintendent and support staff of the office and visit to the college.

Observations

a) Curricular Aspects

Balurghat B.Ed. College is presently affiliated to Baba Saheb Ambedkar Education University, Kolkata. The College follows the curriculum framed and introduced by the said University. It encompasses all the processes of the college such as, the student section, Administrative, Academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for effective teaching and learning. The college is found encouraging students self-study and faculties and students to join various online academic programs for quality enhancement. For effective delivery of curriculum, the sections (M.Ed. and B.Ed.) are maintaining lesson plans and course progress records duly monitored and advised by the Principal. The sections follow the academic calendar of affiliating university. It was observed that the college conducted Add-on Certificate courses, outreach activities, faculty development programmes and non-teaching training programmes during the assessment period. MoUs with institutions both at the State and National Level have been signed and executed to achieve the goals of the curriculum. Special classes were held during this academic period not only for slow learners but for the achievement of the goals of the curriculum, that is, to fully empower the students with the necessary knowledge, techniques and methods of effective classroom teaching.

b) Teaching learning aspects

Assessment of learning levels to identify slow and advanced learners is carried out through examination, seminars, and assignments. Though the College follows students' centric learning method for effective curriculum delivery, a detailed unit-wise plan for experiential and participative learning is satisfactorily maintained for enhancing the learning experiences of the students and improving their intrinsic quality as effective teachers in the society. The College maintains a mentoring system. But documentation of the mentoring system is quite adequate. All the departments related with the conduct internal examinations as per the requirement of the affiliating University were examined and found adequate and satisfactory. The College has already deliberated on the more effective teaching learning modes and methods and incorporated different modes for continuous internal evaluation. Program Outcomes, Program Specific Outcomes, and Course Outcomes are described in the syllabus. Evaluation of the attainment of the learning outcomes is found to have been done in a proper way.

c) Research, Innovation, and Extension

The college has recently launched a drive for the faculty members to undertake research activities. This programme was successfully organized and held in the college as per documents submitted to the auditors who have examined those. The interactions with the faculty members of the college revealed their satisfaction over the series of programmes held for their development in the domains of knowledge and education.

The faculties have developed keen interest in undertaking research activities that include field visit for data collection, research reporting and research paper writing and publication. The initiative of the M.Ed. Section to hold departmental seminars on research methodology and research deserves appreciation. However, the overall research culture in the College needs to be further strengthened. The two sections of the college are conducting very effective extension activities directed toward development in the field of promotion of education, creation of social consciousness, political awareness regarding natural, legal and constitutional rights and duties and also values of democracy. The involvement of the students in those activities is quite satisfactory.

d) Infrastructure

The College has adequate infrastructure facilities for all academic and other extracurricular activities. The college library is adequately enriched with digital library facility and is found to be serving the purposes of students and faculty members not only for course-based leaning support but advanced studies as well. The indoor and outdoor play area is adequate, well-planned and highly motivating. There is commendable facility for yoga education and training for students.

e) Student Support and Progression

Several Departments conduct capacity-building and skill enhancement activities for the students in order to empower them. The placement of the students and progression to higher education is encouraging. Students are encouraged for participation in extracurricular activities in various ways as found and reported by the Principal of the college.

f) Professional Development Activities

Teachers have participated in FDP and the college provides necessary support to teachers to participate in faculty development as well as professional programmes. The college provides for the assessment and evaluation of all faculty and professional development activities. More emphasis needs to be laid on the activities to further improve work culture.

- Various learning supports namely smart class, computer-assisted class, TLMs, online learning facilities through reputed organizations like SWAYAM, etc. provided.

- Hostel Facilities for boys and girls (No student staying in the hostel since during-Covid-and-post-Covid situation). Dakshin Dinajpur University is presently housed in the hostel building in the interest of university education,
- Anti-Ragging and Anti-sexual Cells are active in the college,
- Ramp facility for physically challenged students, faculty members and stakeholders,
- Digital library with text books, reference books and books for advanced knowledge, etc.
- Language laboratory, psychology laboratory, science laboratories, etc. properly maintained.

B) Human resources

- The college has qualified, experienced and dedicated staff.
- Proactive management.
- Adequate community participation.
- Adequate number of poor but meritorious students

C) Learning resources

- Updated curriculum with CBCS
- Effective participation of students in extension activities.
- Quality education at affordable cost with priority on ruralstudents.

Limited financial resources



- Considering' its unique geographic location in largely urban-rural population, Balurghat B.Ed. College has the opportunity to develop itself into a centre of learning catering to the needs of the less privileged ones.
- It can directly contribute towards socio-economic and intellectual uplift of the Balurghat and adjoining areas.
- Research activities encouraged.
- Coaching for competitive examinations for employment both at the state and national level to student aspirants through competent coaching institution (Classroom, Kolkata).
- Collaboration with institutions of higher education and professional institutions for better quality teacher education and student learning.

Challenges

- Renovation and up-gradation of the present physical infrastructure if necessary.
- Mobilization of adequate funds to build up proper physical infrastructure if necessary.

Recommendations

- For effective delivery of curriculum, the course file of Academicdepartments should further be assessed by IQAC
- A centre for local culture and tradition along with a museum maybe set up based on the culture and tradition of greater Balurghat area.
- More sections and students should be involved in the extension activities.
- Best practices of individual departments should be identified and need to be institutionalized.
